

Level 2 CPR and AED (RQF) Course

After a **cardiac arrest**, **every minute** without CPR and **defibrillation** reduces someone's chance of survival by 10 per cent."*

A **cardiac arrest** can happen at **any age** and at **any time**. Possible causes include heart and circulatory disease, loss of blood, trauma (such as a blow to the area directly over the heart), electrocution or Sudden Arrhythmic Death Syndrome (SADS, often caused by genetic defect). An **Automated External Defibrillator** is a battery powered, small, lightweight device that analyses a person's heart rhythm and can recognise irregular heart rhythms such as ventricular fibrillation and ventricular tachycardia – also known as Sudden Cardiac Arrest. When a cardiac arrest occurs, **CPR** can help to circulate oxygen to the body's **vital organs**. This will help prevent further deterioration so that defibrillation can be administered.
